# Friday 10:00 to 11:30 AM Scroll Saw Basics, Fundamentals and Troubleshooting presented by Dave Kettunen

Dave will discuss setting up your scroll saw, handy tools for scrollers, and things to consider when working with paper patterns. He will talk about techniques for drilling holes, and scrolling corners, circles, and straight lines. There will be a discussion on blade selection, prevention of burning, stack cutting, pattern removal and much more! There will also be a question and answer period.

#### Friday 10:00 to 11:30 AM Cutting with Live Edge - presented by Peg Senholtz

Have you ever wondered how to cut those long scenes into a slab of wood that still has the bark on it? If so, this is the class for you. Peg will discuss tips and techniques for using spiral blades, talk about supporting longer pieces of wood for those wide patterns while sawing, and give some insights on how to adjust a single pattern or put several patterns together to make it fit the size and shape of your slab. She will also show examples of other types of live edge projects, such as round limb slabs with bark on them. Get ready to be inspired to make your own unique and creative live edge project!

## Friday 10 AM to 12 Noon (lunch break) 1:00 to 3:00 PM Basics of Spindle Turning presented by Lyndal Anthony

As Lyndal teaches the basics of wood turning, students will learn to use a spindle gouge to turn a cove (concave radius) and a bead (convex radius). Lyndal will be on hand to offer advice and answer questions as students make spindles to take home with them. Keep in mind that this class will focus on making wood chips because learning technique is the primary goal. (Practice, practice, practice so wet wood will be used).

### Friday 12 Noon to 1:30 PM Intarsia Fundamentals- presented by

This class will start with an overall description of Intarsia. Use of wood colors and grain patterns to enhance your projects and also using various tools and safety measures will be discussed. You will learn different techniques for fitting and shaping, how to achieve smooth transitions, and talk about adding a finish to your project.

#### Friday 12 Noon to 3:00 PM Introduction to Woodburning - presented by Michele Parsons

In this class, you will learn basic pyrography (woodburning) techniques to add interest to your wood projects. If you can trace lines, you can create a drawing using this burning technique. You will learn about different types of equipment, basic pen tips, safety, selecting and preparing your wood, transferring a pattern, coloring, and applying a finish. You will be using the basic pens to practice woodburning techniques. Then, with Michele's guidance, you will create your own pyrographic masterpiece to take home.
